ARE YOU ELIGIBLE?

Visit [WEVax.ca](https://www.wevax.ca) to find out.

Clinics don't accept walk-ins.

GET READY TO REGISTER

To register, you will need:

- Your contact information and address
- Your health card number (if you have one)

REGISTER

If eligible, register online at [wechu.org](https://www.wechu.org).

If you need help registering, call **226-773-2200**.

PREPARE FOR YOUR APPOINTMENT

- Take medications and eat meals as usual.
- Do not wear scented products.
- Wear a loose-fitting top or a t-shirt that provides easy access to your arms.
- Strive to arrive within 10 minutes of your appointment, not sooner.

WHAT TO BRING TO YOUR APPOINTMENT

- Your health card or other government-issued photo ID such as a driver's licence, passport, Status Card or other provincial health cards
- Assistive devices as needed (e.g. scooter, wheelchair, cane)
- Reading glasses and/or hearing aid if required
- A face mask
- A support person, if required (e.g. friend or family member, interpreter, etc.)

WHEN YOU ARRIVE AT THE CLINIC

- Expect to be on site for at least 30-60 minutes.
- Complete a check-in process as you drive in, park (free) and proceed as directed.
- Get vaccinated!
- Remain 15 minutes in an observation area.

Note: All clinics are wheelchair accessible.
