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FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

I am absolutely delighted to provide my first report as the Executive Director of the Multicultural Council of Windsor and Essex County (MCC).

In my 10 years with the Multicultural Council, I have had the privilege of working alongside Kathleen Thomas, benefitting from her three decades of leadership in our community. Her retirement earlier this year reminded us that under her direction, the MCC became a nationally recognized leader in providing settlement and integration services with the region's most diverse roster of community programs, services and events. While she is missed, we all wish her much joy (and lots of travel!) in her retirement.

During our last fiscal year, the MCC continued our commitment to our clients and our community. Faced with multiple waves of COVID-19 in 2021-2022, community leadership focused on the vaccination of residents. The MCC was part of these efforts, launching **'A World of Reasons'** - a community-wide multilingual campaign, delivering valuable reassurance and support to residents of Windsor-Essex.

In collaboration with community partners and health professionals from across our region, the initiative was aimed at eliminating language-based vaccine hesitancy. Through a video campaign, radio ads, translated information flyers, vaccination clinics and outreach to our ethno cultural partners, the MCC ensured timely and appropriate information was available to all residents regardless of literacy level or language. We are proud of our team's role in ensuring community health and safety.

Buoyed by the support of partners and stakeholders, we reinvested in programming and activities designed to meet our mission of creating a welcoming community for all.

- Our new Oral Health Program, supported by Windsor Essex Community Foundation and Greenshield served to both educate and provide dental health services to our region.
- Our partnership with LIUNA 625 allowed for a social media campaign in support of our Indigenous community by sharing the Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada 'Calls to Action'.
- Our partnership with ENWIN provided for 'Diversity Dynamics', a weekly series of informative and encouraging posts intended to provide guidance in establishing and maintaining inclusive practices.
- The Government of Canada supported our second Carrousel@Home event. Together with our partners at LIUNA 625, Bell Media, Tourism Windsor Essex Pelee Island and the Windsor Spitfires, we were able to share (safely!) the incredible culture and tradition that makes our region so unique.
- We unveiled our first-ever Carrousel mural located at Devonshire Mall, showcasing more than four decades of celebration and creating a welcoming community for all.
- We re-started MCC Employment programs through partnerships with the Government of Ontario and the Solcz Family Foundation. MCC Leadership and MCC Work Ready were designed to provide opportunities for youth facing barriers to entering the Canadian skilled trades job market.

Earlier this year, after three years absence, the MCC held its first in-person Herb Gray Harmony Gala - to a sold-out audience.

Carrousel of the Nations returned for its 48th festival and welcomed the largest crowds in event history. We re-opened our doors to clients and added a record amount of new programming in just a few short months.

I am so proud of the work done by MCC management and staff during 2021-2022. Their selfless devotion to the agency and our community laid the ground work for success as we begin our new chapter together.

Thank you to our passionate staff, our devoted board, our dedicated volunteers and our generous partners. Together we are creating a more welcoming community for all.

The Multicultural Council of Windsor and Essex County's mission is to create a welcoming community for all through education, community engagement and the promotion of diversity and equality. Embracing our vision of being an innovative leader in facilitating the development of an inclusive and welcoming community, the MCC serves to support both those within underrepresented sectors and those in our community.

We provide award-winning programming in the areas of Language, Orientation, and Welcoming, Settlement and Integration, Health, and Wellness, Employment, Special Events, and Community Engagement based on individual eligibility and suitability.

In contrast to limited-service providers, the MCC offers seamless, single-agency coordination of services. Community partners, families, and individuals are able to receive expert information and support across multiple sectors while establishing familiar professional relationships.

Our agency embraces a holistic approach to support services, extending beyond the logistics of resettlement and providing opportunities for community and civic engagement, and personal and professional development. We are exceedingly proud of our history of offering varied programs and of serving as the lead agency for numerous major initiatives in our community.

As champions of diversity and harmony, our organization strives to identify and address cultural and societal barriers throughout our city, county, and region.



NEWCOMER SETTLEMENT PROGRAM (NSP)

NSP provides referral and information services to Naturalized Canadian Citizens, Refugee Claimants, Convention Refugees, Temporary Foreign Workers and International Students.



CLIENT SUPPORT SERVICES PROGRAM (CSSS)

This nation-wide program provides an additional 12 to 18 months of personalized case management to Government Assisted Refugee clients, easing the transition to new communities and new homes.



ORIENTATION TO ONTARIO (O2O)

This program provides essential information about resettling in Ontario and connecting to community services.



ORIENTATION SERVICES

Orientation staff work one-on-one with clients providing support, information, referrals, and advocacy. They also offer specialized group information sessions and workshops.



THE WINDSOR RESETTLEMENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (WRAP)

This program provides immediate and essential services to Government Assisted Refugees during their first few weeks in Canada. MCC team members greet clients upon arrival at Windsor Airport, provide temporary accommodations, assist in finding permanent homes, enrol children in school, refer to services in the community and provide essential life skills training.



CARE FOR NEWCOMER CHILDREN (CNC)

MCC parents rely on this program to provide childcare services while attending MCC training or language classes. Our experienced Early Childhood Educators supervise children and organize educational and entertaining activities which emphasize both skill and social development.





MCC EMPLOYMENT

The MCC Employment Department provides dedicated job-based support which includes successful and dynamic initiatives designed to prepare individuals for the Canadian workplace. Programs like MCC Youth Work Ready and MCC Leadership are delivered in partnership with Majors McGuire and offer free training and industry-specific certification providing participants with the professional tools needed to become employed. Thank you to the Government of Ontario and the Solcz Family Foundation for their support of these important programs.



MCC HEALTH CLINIC

Our Nurse Practitioner provides care to clients of the MCC who do not have a family physician. The service is free and does not require an Ontario Health Card. Our Nurse Practitioner also serves as the MCC representative on numerous committees advocating for newcomer health and guiding the community on newcomer health needs.



ORAL HEALTH AND WELLNESS

Funded by the GSC Six4Six Community Granting Initiative through the Windsor Essex Community Foundation, this program provides Oral Health education, resources and services to newcomers and immigrants of all ages.



MCC AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAM

Our team engages youth in structured activities that include English literacy, math science, arts and crafts and LOTS of fun.



CANADA CONNECTS

This matching program connects newcomers with community residents, establishing social networks and creating valuable relationships.



MCC SENIORS GROUP

Our seniors meet weekly for an hour to practice their English, make friends and learn about Canadian culture.



MCC ARTS AND CRAFTS GROUP

Our creative clients learn new skills, socialize and practice their English language skills.

VACCINE NAVIGATION PROJECT

This program aims to increase COVID-19 vaccine knowledge and uptake among vulnerable and newcomer populations. Our team also provide assistance and support to all clients throughout the vaccination process.



HERB GRAY HARMONY GALA

For twenty years, the MCC has held an annual evening of appreciation celebrating those who have made an outstanding contribution to building a community that is more welcoming for all.

Three awards are presented: Herb Gray Harmony Award recognizing an individual, business or organization that has actively worked towards building a more harmonious community.

MCC Champion Award celebrating significant contributions made to our community by first-generation Canadians. Kathleen Thomas Inspire Award recognizing a newcomer for their perseverance, optimism, and positive example provided to our community.

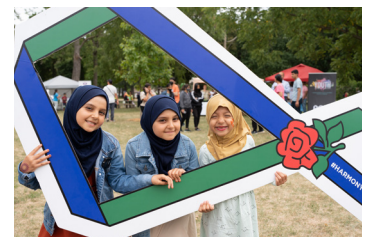
MCC HEALTH AND WELLNESS EXPO

Led by the Multicultural Council, the expo is a joint venture of Community Partners for Multicultural Health. Since 2002, the CPMH has presented this event to promote healthy choices and to improve awareness of and access to local health and social services for newcomers.

The Harmony Ribbon, created in 1995 by the Multicultural Council of Windsor and Essex County (MCC), is a visible symbol of mutual respect and understanding. THE MCC'S LANGUAGE TRAINING PROGRAM

Classes provide clients with eight levels of English language training covering 4 areas: listening, speaking, reading and writing. Classes are free of charge to clients. Upon graduation from level 8, students have the language skills to fully engage in the community.



MCC INTERPRETATION AND TRANSLATION DEPARTMENT

The MCC offers interpretation and translation in over 70 languages, 24 hours a day, seven days a week. As the region's largest local provider, MCC's professional and confidential services are accessed by newcomers, community organizations, individuals and businesses.

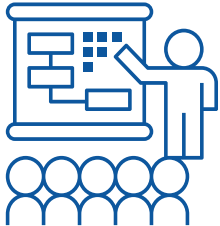

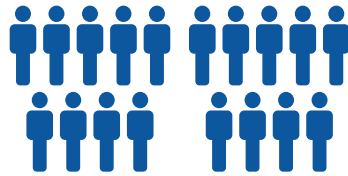

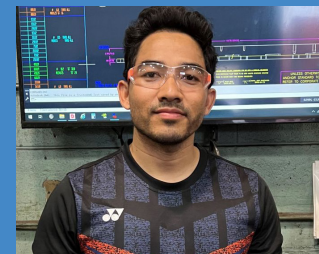
